

BROWN BEERS



Corsendonk Pater (Corsendonk). This beer has caramelized malt on the nose with hints of ripe fruit. Mild on the palate with well-balanced bitterness, hints of fruit, toasted bread, liquorice, coffee and caramel.
ABV 6.5%



Moose Blues (Brouwerij t'Verzet). The caramel is the first flavour to jump out, immediately followed by liquorice. With the addition of Canadian maple syrup, the taste evolves into fruity and herbal. Hints of chocolate, raisins and aniseed complete the whole nicely.
ABV 7.5%



Satan Red (Brewery De Block). A perfectly balanced ruby-red beer, a harmony of creamy and strong aroma, sweet and fine pallet, fruity with a perfume of fresh hops. Feel the heat ... and taste the fine aroma and the sweet and delicious pallet.

Barbär Bok (Brasserie Lefebvre). A solid and expressive brown ale, Barbär Botha's inherited its original recipe, based on malt, soft wheat and honey, from its famous big sister.
ABV 8.5%



Gouden Carolus Classic (Brouwerij Het Anker). Chosen as Best Dark Beer in the World (2012). This "Grand Imperial Beer" is brewed with dark, aromatic malts which provide, in combination with a traditional high fermentation, a unique beer that unites the warmth of wine and the freshness of beer.

Keizer Karel Charles Quint Rood (Brouwerij Haacht). Ruby red in colour with a creamy, warm-white head. Fruity aroma flavours. A soft, full taste that develops into a lightly sweet, hoppy aftertaste.

Malheur 12 (Malheur). The Malheur 12°, with its 12% alcohol by volume and deep chestnut colour is the crown jewel in the family of Malheur quality beers. This chestnut-coloured beer releases a delightful bouquet of spices and rich hop flowers and has a full-bodied flavour. Take the time to discover this delicious tasting beer, which attests to pure craftsmanship.
